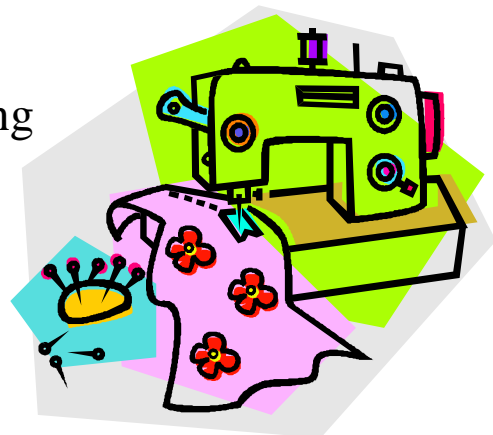

AUDITORIUM DEDICATION

I attended the dedication ceremony of the new Troy Memorial Auditorium in March. When we first went in, we had refreshments. Mr. Grantier and the others had the event to show the new auditorium to the community. Students in the jazz band played their instruments while people were coming in. Mr. Evans, a guest speaker, talked about his family history with the Troy schools. There was a flag presentation and the choir sang the National Anthem. Next four pastors said small prayers.
